Realm of Caring California hosts clothing drive at 2014 Walk to End Epilepsy

While thousands of people descended on the Rose Bowl on Sunday to take part in the 2014 Walk to End Epilepsy #W2EE, many of them arrived with bags of clothing to donate as well.

This year, in partnership with End Epilepsy®, Realm of Caring California hosted a clothing drive at the Walk. The drive allowed those attending the Walk to double-down on their efforts in the Fight to End Epilepsy.

The clothing donated will go to Savers Thrift Stores, which has a partnership with the Epilepsy Foundation that helps fundraising efforts for the foundation and its affiliates.

Realm of Caring California was also able to raise funds from the drive as well by taking part in the "Cash for Clothes" program offered by Savers which allows other non-profits to partner with the Epilepsy Foundation to raise money for their own causes by hosting clothing drives.

Realm of Caring California is actively involved in raising awareness to alternative treatment methods for those who have epilepsy. The primary method of treatment that Realm of Caring focuses on is the use of Cannabidiol Oil (CBD).

This was the first year the Walk to End Epilepsy featured a clothing drive and the results were fantastic. Attendees of the walk donated over 600 lbs. of clothing and Realm of Caring California was thrilled with the turnout.
